Sat April 18, 2020 - 9:30 am—3:30 pm—Spurgeon Hollow Trailhead (7695 N Delaney Park Rd, Scottsburg, IN, USA 47170) Knobstone Section Hike part 1

This will be the first section hike along parts of the original KT. A 12 mile loop with extreme elevation change for Indiana. Participants should bring plenty of water and snacks, along with first aid, hiking poles, the correct gear for whatever the weather may be, and perhaps a small meal for a break at a little over halfway. The first hill starts within a quarter mile of the trailhead, and after a few hundred feet of elevation you'll know immediately if this is where you need to turn around! This will be a rain or shine event, only high winds will cause this event to be cancelled. I'm hoping to host the complete trail in section hikes on the 3rd Staurdays of April, May, September and October.

Sat May 16, 2020 9:30am – 3:30pm (EDT) - Oxley Memorial Trailhead (7741 E Banes Hollow Rd, Scottsburg , IN, USA 47170)

## Knobstone Section Hike part 2

This is to be the second section hike of the original KT, from the Oxley Memorial Trailhead to the Leota Trailhead, about 13 miles. This is planned as a one day section hike, but with enough interest it may turn into a 2 day out and back overnight trip to accommodate more individuals. I can shuttle 6 hikers with my van, but will need a volunteer to pick me up at the Leota Trailhead and shuttle me back to the Oxley Memorial Trailhead before 9am. This is a very rugged trail, so bring plenty of water and snacks, hiking poles, first aid gear and the correct apparel for weather conditions. As always, we'll take a break at a halfway point and stop for a small meal. Also this is a rain or shine event, the only chance of cancelation will be due to extreme wind.

Sat Sep 19, 2020 9:30am – 5:30pm (EDT) Leota Trailhead (12598 E Saylor Rd, Salem, IN, USA 47167)

### Knobstone Section Hike part 3

The third and likely most difficult section hike of the original KT I'll be leading, from the Leota Trailhead to Pixley Knob. Covering roughly 15 miles, this one will be a test. This is planned as a one day section hike, but with enough interest it may turn into a 2 day out and back overnight trip to accommodate more individuals. I can shuttle 6 hikers with my van, but will need a volunteer to pick me up at the Pixley Knob Trailhead and shuttle me back to the Leota Trailhead before 9am. This is a very rugged trail, so bring plenty of water and snacks, hiking poles, first aid gear and the correct apparel for weather conditions. As always, we'll take a break at a halfway point and stop for a small meal. Also this is a rain or shine event, the only chance of cancelation will be due to extreme wind.

Sat Oct 17, 2020 9:30 am—2:30 pm (EDT) Pixley Knob Trailhead (18559 Pixley Knob Road, Henryville, IN, USA 47126)

# Knobstone Section Hike part 4

The final section of the original KT hike! Starting from the Pixley Knob Road Trailhead and finishing at the Deam Lake Trailhead. About 10 miles of hiking, with the last several being downhill! This section offers some of the best views, especially from the Round Knob lookout. I can shuttle 6 hikers with my van, but will need a volunteer to pick me up at the Deam Lake Trailhead and shuttle me back to the Pixley Knob Trailhead before 9am. This is still a very rugged trail, so bring plenty of water and snacks, hiking poles, first aid gear and the correct apparel for weather conditions. As always, we'll take a break at a halfway point and stop for a small meal. Also this is a rain or shine event, the only chance of cancelation will be due to extreme wind.



What's The Best Way To Remove Old Rebar Stuck In The Ground?

Old rebar abound on the original KT where many wooden steps were installed with rebar. Over the years the steps have rotted, sometimes completely away. Left behind are the iron rebar pegs sticking out of the ground or the remains of the steps. These are difficult to see and poze a hazard to hikers who may step on, trip over, or fall on the exposed pegs. Adopter Todd Stewart has found the solution, vice grip pliers that hold tight and give you leverage. Without the locking pliers it is difficult to get a good grip on the rebar. And you run the danger of abasing you hand if your grip slips. Here's a bunch that Phil has successfully removed.


